<b>restaurant</b>	(N.)	a place where you can buy and eat a meal	We went out to the <b>restaurant</b> last night.
<b>eat out</b>	(PHRV.)	to eat at a restaurant	How often do you <b>eat out</b> ?
<b>order</b>	(V.)	to ask for food or drink in a restaurant	I <b>ordered</b> a bottle of beer.
<b>menu</b>	(N.)	a list of the food that you can order at a restaurant	Can I see the wine <b>menu</b> ?
<b>beverage</b>	(N.)	a drink	What kind of <b>beverages</b> do you have?

**May**

Pineapple juice, please.



**Waiter**

Certainly. I'll be back with your beverage in a minute.
