annoy	(V)	to make someone slightly angry	I am really <b>annoyed</b> by his actions.
definitely	(INT.)	of course, absolutely, certainly	Do you want to go with me? // <b>Definitely!</b>
wavy	(ADJ)	with curves, not straight	She looks great with her <b>wavy</b> hair.
anytime	(INT.)	used to say that you are willing to do something again, at any time	Thank you so much! // <b>Anytime!</b>
