### Vocabulary

look for	(Phrv)	to try to find something	Did you find what you were <b>looking for</b> ?
conference room	(N)	a room for business meetings	The meeting was held in a small <b>conference room</b> .
recall	(v)	to remember something	I cannot <b>recall</b> her name.
drawer	(N)	a container shaped like a box that is part of a desk or other piece of furniture that slides in and out	I put my stuff inside my <b>drawer</b> .
Don't mention it	(Phrase)	used to answer someone who has just thanked you for something	<b>Don't mention it.</b> I'm glad to help you.
