### Exercise 01

### Vocabulary

scare	(V)	to make someone feel afraid or frightened	The sudden flash of lightning <b>scared</b> me.
trick	(V)	to make someone believe something which is not true, in order to get something from them or as a joke	He <b>tricked</b> my wife and stole her purse.
treat	(V)	to do or buy something for someone	She <b>treated</b> me to tea and cookies.
wrap	(V)	to cover something completely in paper or some other material	The store did a beautiful job of <b>wrapping</b> the gift.
penny	(N)	a small coin	Mommy, give me some <b>pennies</b> to buy a candy.

Trick or treat!



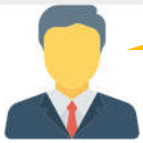
**Mr.mel**

If you don't treat me, I'll trick you.



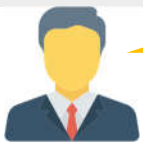
**Mr.mel**
